

NPCA Advocacy:

In the recent past Congress voted on two bills for which the National Peace Corps Association had asked former volunteers to advocate. One was the Peace Corps Equity Act, the

other Peace Corps budget for FY 2014. I'm pleased to report that both bills passed.

The Peace Corps Equity Act now makes it possible, as has been the case for military service women, for female volunteers to have the option of receiving abortion services in instances of rape, incest and life endangerment while serving oversees. The bill passed both houses of Congress by a wide margin.

The Peace Corps budget finally approved by both houses of Congress is for \$378 until the end of the 2014 fiscal year. This was the same amount requested by the Obama Administration before the sequestration - \$22 mil. more than was recommended by the House of Representatives and \$6 mil. less than approved initially slated by the Senate. Peace Corps staff had been worried that the compromise finally agreed upon would be less.

Many kudos and thanks to Tish Herries, Gerry Blackman and Peter Baker for taking the time to meet with staff members of Sen. Baucus, Sen. Tester and Rep. Daines to speak on behalf of these bills. All three representatives voted in favor of the Peace Corps Equity Act, and Sens. Baucus and Tester also supported the final budget bill. Rep. Daines unfortunately dissented.

Peace Corps is required to submit its FY 2015 budget request to the White House in March, and the Administration is scheduled to send its request to Congress in August. In addition to the Masters International Programs that the U has run for years it now houses a special Peace Corps preparation class.

She served as a volunteer in Thailand and after a short time in the private sector joined Peace Corps staff. After which she served three years as regional director for the Europe, Mediterranean ad Asia region where see oversaw Peace Corps programs in 21 countries.
