Jeanne Younger (Honduras 86-88), seen in the photo above, was a vital part of our group almost from the beginning. After having a few small gatherings in the late 80's a few of us decided to attend the National Conference of Returned Volunteers in Eugene, Oregon in 1990. Jeanne, her daughter, Mary Younger (Cameroon 74-76), Dave McGoldrick (Zaire 86-88) and I drove out for the 3 day event. We were all impressed with Jeanne's enthusiasm for life and people. It was quite a reunion when she met some of the volunteers she had served with just a few years earlier.

When we returned, we decided to become an affiliated group of RPCVs and joined the NPCA. Jeanne lived in Helena and was our representative from Helena for years. She and her husband, Al Carpenter (Honduras 86-88) attended the first Goat Chase Retreat and were responsible for getting many of the other Helena RPCVs to attend. She met Al while in Honduras and they got married shortly after returning. She also was instrumental in selling a ton of International Calendars in Helena. The following press release came out at the beginning of the year and later another one came out showing that the U of M ranked number 7 among medium sized Universities for recruiting Peace Corps Volunteers in 2016.

Washington, D.C. Metro Area reclaims no.1 spot for first time since 2009

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 20, 2016 – The Peace Corps today released its 2016 rankings of the top volunteer-producing states and metropolitan areas across the country. For the first time in six years, Washington-Arlington-Alexandria is the largest metropolitan-area producer of volunteers, bumping longtime leader New York-Northern New Jersey-Long Island to no.2 on the total volunteers list this year. Vermont and California remain no.1 on the respective per capita and total volunteer-producing states lists. Montana has also made impressive strides this year with Missoula, Montana making its first appearance since 2011 in the no.1 spot for top metro areas per capita and The Treasure State climbing to no. 3 on the list of top states per capita.

For the first time, the District of Columbia and surrounding states appear on this year's top states per capita rankings with D.C., Maryland and Virginia sitting at no.2, no.7 and no.8, respectively. This is Maryland's first time in recent history on both the top states per capita (no.7) and total top states (no.9) lists. Washington-Arlington-Alexandria (no.6) joined fellow rankings newcomers Idaho Falls, Idaho (no.5) and East Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania (no.10) on the top metro areas per capita. This year is the sixth-consecutive year that Washington State has appeared in all four ranking categories and, for the first time, shares the honor this year with Virginia and Maryland.

"During my time leading the Peace Corps, I have seen the tremendous impact that volunteers have when they share their unique hometown perspectives with the communities they serve," said Director Carrie Hessler-Radelet. "Volunteers represent our nation's rich diversity by coming from all corners of the U.S. They are able to share our nation's rich cultural heritage with communities around the world, leaving a legacy of peace and friendship that is timeless."

This year's rankings follow the launch of a refreshed Peace Corps brand platform that embraces a digitally focused communications approach to make the agency more accessible to all audiences across the United States through the platforms they already use. Sweeping reforms in the application and recruitment system ensure that Peace Corps continues to build a volunteer corps of Americans from all walks of life. Applicants will now find a simplified, more personal application process, and can learn more by visiting the Peace Corps website and connecting with a recruiter.

Detailed directions and an agenda will be sent upon receipt of the completed registration form.

Rustic cabins, a variety of recreational facilities, and a lakeside bonfire site make a wonderful setting for reconnecting with old friends and making new ones. Everyone must provide their own bedding and *no alcohol or pets* are allowed on the grounds. There are cooking facilities in the cabins and a large lounge and communal kitchen for the grand international potluck on Saturday night. Saturday and Sunday's breakfasts are included in the registration fee. Saturday's lunch is on your own. We are going to continue with the tradition of a mini-international potluck for the Friday night meal. The registration fee of \$90 includes the cost of lodging, breakfasts on Saturday and Sunday. For those of you with children you will notice a change in the fee structure. It also includes use of the retreat center where we meet and have our meals.
