MFA DEGREE IN CREATIVE WRITING

Do you want to earn your Master's Degree in Creative Writing while working full time or serving in the Peace Corps? You can enroll as a student and not have to step onto a college campus. Write you memoir or book about your Peace Corps experience while working full time.

Here's your chance to do at all.

NPCA is pleased to announce partnership with National University to offer a TOTALLY ONLINE Master of Fine Arts (MFA) degree for Peace Corps Writers.

The inaugural program is slated to begin in Fall 2016. The initial coursework will focus on the Peace Corps experience and how students might develop that material into a memoir or non-fiction book.

TUITION IS APPROXIMATELY 20K

FINANCIAL AID IS AVAILABLE

All classes are online. There are no classes on campus. The student controls his or her agency of time spend at the computer. Classes are one at a time for one-month or two-months in duration.

Peace Corps Writers

Because of NPCA's partnership in the Creative Writing program, applicants could receive a tuition discount for the degree if they are a NPCA Member, as well as a:

- § Current Peace Corps Volunteer
- § Returned Peace Corps Volunteer
- § Current or former Peace Corps staff member

What Is An MFA?

The MFA is considered a terminal degree. It qualifies you to teach creative writing classes at the college level. At many universities it will also qualify you to teach basic writing classes like composition. It depends on the university. It is much easier to get your foot in the door teaching composition classes.

The MFA Degree

The MFA is a flexible program. Students can complete the degree within two years, progressing at their own pace. As all courses are online, students can live anywhere in the world while enrolled. Consequently, the degree in Creative Writing at National University is rare among other MFA programs: It is one of very few with no residency requirement. Courses are taught by established writers in the field who share their perspective and expertise in the craft.

This program is excellent preparation for a professional career in writing, working in the areas of publishing or filmmaking, and is the minimal academic qualification appropriate for those who desire to teach creative writing at the college or university level.

National University


National University is the second-largest private, nonprofit institution of higher education in California and the 12th largest in the United States. It is one of the very few universities that offer a totally online MFA Creative Writing degree.
